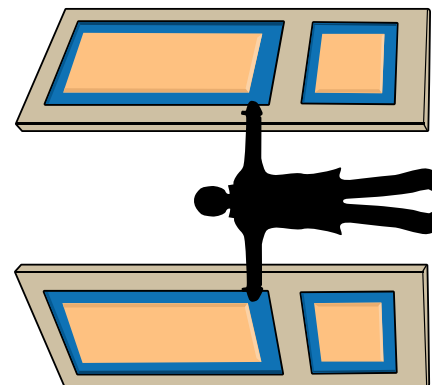

Who are we?

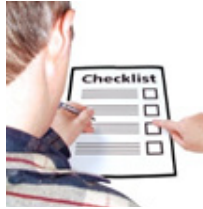
Access in Dudley is a user led organisation of mainly disabled people. We are all volunteers.
